The Latronix AB Conflict Minerals Compliance Program is implemented with guidance obtained from the Final Rules of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act published August 22nd, 2012.

Latronix AB is committed to meet the requirements of all applicable Conflict Minerals¹ related laws and regulations in order to comply with the obligations of the Dodd-Frank Act.

Latronix AB does not directly purchase any raw material and consequently does not directly source minerals form the DRC.

Latronix AB products have been manufactured without the intentional use of conflict minerals.

Latronix AB has implemented processes and procedures to help ensure that our suppliers comply with our expectations. We have communicated our requirements to our suppliers to determine the sources of any Conflict Minerals contained in our products. We have received declarations from our suppliers confirming their commitment.

Latronix AB is committed to the responsible sourcing of conflict minerals throughout our supply chain and continuing to comply with the underlying SEC rules (U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission) and regulations surrounding conflict minerals to enable all Latronix products as Conflict Free.
